Abstract:

I put forth and defend what I call ‘the function correspondence account’ of organized social groups (e.g., pick-up basketball teams, families, and rock bands), according to which an organized social group is a composite whole that may vary in its constitution. The first part of the dissertation is a critical survey of various leading metaphysical accounts of organized social groups, none of which, I argue, can adequately capture the intuitive persistence conditions of such things. The rest of the dissertation is dedicated to sketching out and defending a novel, alternative account, one that avoids the problems faced by accounts examined in the first part.
